Community

Williams Bay Middle/High School, built in 1996, serves the village of Williams Bay and the townships of Geneva, Linn, Walworth and Delavan. These communities are located around the Northwestern shores of beautiful Lake Geneva and the residents enjoy the many year-round recreational activities associated with the lake and the area's tourist industry. Williams Bay is also home of the Yerkes Observatory and George Williams College.

The District consists of one (4K-5) elementary school and one middle/high school (6-12).

School

Williams Bay Middle/High School is a publicschool enrolling about 380 students. Recipient of the U.S. Department of Education Excellence in Education Award and is accredited by the North Central Association.

School year: Two semesters of 18 weeks each. Eight class periods of 44 min. each

Courses: Over 100 course selections are offered including AP, Honors, Special Education and Career and Technical Education. Students could earn credit through Youth Options or Distance/ Online Learning.
